Who is Anne Frank ?

The Battle of Britain was a pivotal air campaign fought between the British Royal Air Force and the German Luftwaffe during World War II.



What happened to Hiroshima?

Hiroshima was the target of the first atomic bomb dropped by the United States during World War II, resulting in devastating destruction and loss of life.



What occurred at Dunkirk?

Dunkirk was the evacuation of Allied soldiers from the beaches of Dunkirk, France, during World War II, saving thousands of lives.

The Windrush generation refers to Caribbean immigrants who arrived in Britain between 1948 and 1971. They came to help rebuild post-war Britain and fill



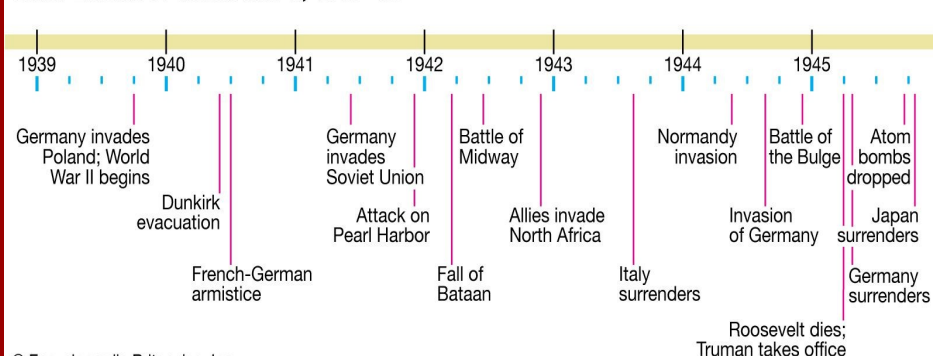

Modern day Germany in comparison to WW2 Germany

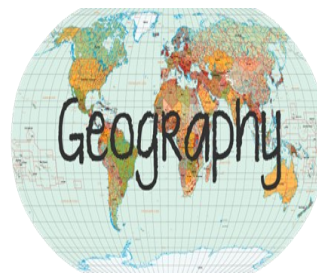
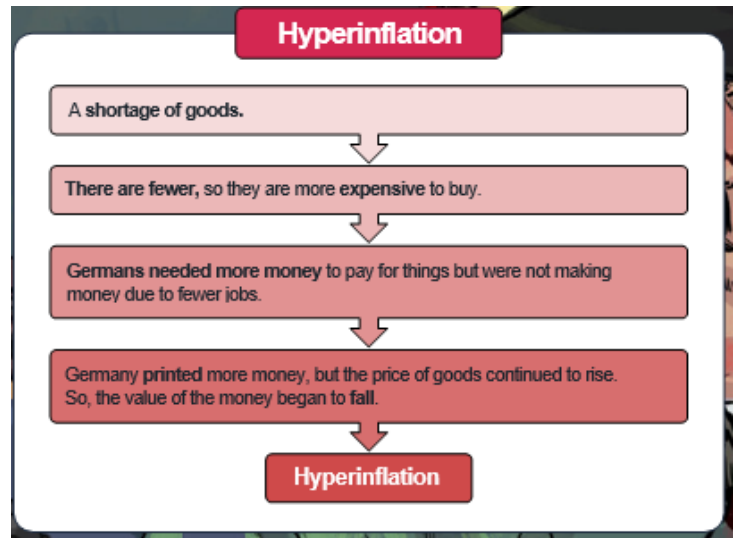
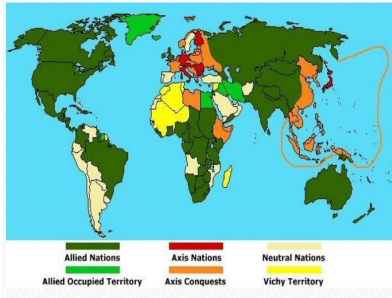
Modern-day Germany is a democratic country with a strong emphasis on human rights and peace, in stark contrast to the Nazi regime and aggression during World War II.

Key countries and their role in WW2:

- Germany: Axis power led by Hitler
- United States: Allied power, joined the war after Pearl Harbour
- Soviet Union: Allied power, fought on the Eastern Front
- United Kingdom: Allied power, led by Churchill
- Japan: Axis power, attacked Pearl Harbour, later surrendered after atomic bombings

Britain's economy during the war

Britain's economy during World War II was heavily mobilised for war production, with resources and industries focused on supporting the war effort.

Perspective

Perspective drawing is a technique that creates the illusion of depth and three-dimensionality on a two-dimensional surface, using vanishing points and horizon lines.

Stencilling for Printing

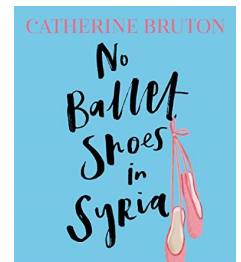
Stencilling in art involves creating a design by cutting or tracing a template and applying paint or ink over it.

Key Words

Activism— Campaigning for political or social change

Propaganda —Propaganda is biased or misleading information, often through media used to shape public opinion and influence behaviour.

Secondary sources - Secondary sources in history are interpretations or analyses of primary sources by historians or scholars.
